



Wayne Sutcliffe

Certainly one of the most successful soccer coaches in Mercer County history, Wayne Sutcliffe has a record of sideline accomplishments that is unrivaled. For over thirty years of excellence in Mercer County soccer, we are happy to induct Wayne Sutcliffe into the Mercer County Soccer Hall of Fame.

A product of Moorestown NJ, Wayne played for the Moorestown High School Quakers before swimming across the river to matriculate at Temple University. His club experience saw him play for the Ukrainian Americans in the USL and Soccer Locker in the South Jersey Amateur League. But it was his entry into coaching where he started his journey into the Hall of Fame. As the coach of Moorestown Friends School and the technical director of the Moorestown Soccer Club, he took his first steps forward.

In 1997, Wayne became the head boys coach at Princeton High School. The results were considerable to say the least. Over his thirty-five year career, his teams posted a

397 win, 101 loss, and 40 ties record. The Little Tigers were Group Three State Champions in 2009 and 2012, also being Group Three finalists in 2014 and Group Four finalists in 2017.

It gets better. Seven Central Jersey Sectional championships, seven Mercer County Tournament Championships, and SIXTEEN Colonial Valley Conference championships.

He was honored as the State Coach of the Year in 2009 by the Soccer Coaches Association of NJ and the Coach of the Year in both 2008 and 2015 by the National Soccer Coaches of America/Adidas.

Most definitely his proudest achievement is that forty of his former players went on to play college soccer. Countless of his players earned All-Conference, All-County, and All-State honors under his guidance.

A resident of Princeton, and with a record that is hard to match, we welcome Wayne Sutcliffe into the Mercer County Soccer Hall of Fame, Class of 2025
